DITCH/CANAL COMPANIES' INITIAL STEPS IN CONSIDERING CONVERTING TO A LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

- 1. Have a meeting or conduct a straw poll to obtain a sense of whether there is sufficient preliminary support within the ditch company to proceed with preliminary steps to explore formation of a local improvement district.
- 2. If there is sufficient support, begin to investigate the potential boundaries for the local improvement district based upon identifying all lands receiving water through the existing ditch and any related laterals.
- 3. Identify any laterals off the ditch which diverts from the River which laterals support one or more users.
 - 4. Identify owners of land within potential boundaries.
- 5. Gather information related to the status of the easement, whether express or prescriptive, for the ditch from the River to the terminus of the ditch, including for any laterals.
- 6. Gather information concerning the existing ditch company, including if a corporation, its articles of incorporation, bylaws and shareholder list, and if it is a tenant-incommon ditch, all users on the ditch.
 - 7. Provide the information obtained under 2 through 6 above to the District.
