Meeting Called to Order

Steven Fulstone called the meeting to order at 9:05 am.

Public Comment

None presented.

Consideration of Minutes of the September 27, 2018 Annual Meeting

The agenda needed to be corrected from August 27th to September 27th. Steven Fulstone requested clarification on the mention of the ledge being fixed. The minutes need to be clarified that the property belongs to Deforest. Lu Weaver made a motion to accept the minutes with the clarification; Rob Lewis offered a second. The vote was called for and passed.

Consideration of Minutes of the April 23, 2019 Advisory Board Meeting

Steven Fulstone requested clarification that historically, in dry years, the canal is mossed twice and wet years the canal is mossed three times. Lu Weaver made a motion to accept the minutes with the clarification; Rob Lewis offered a second. The vote was called for and passed.

Marianne Leinassar requested confirmation on certified letters being sent to Deforest and Tran to fix the problem with their properties. Bert advised the letters were mailed. Tran's letter was unclaimed and Deforest did sign for his letter. Rob stated the problem must be taken care of even if the District must do it. Marianne stated the Canal should not have to pay for the project; Rob Lewis requested to know if the landowners could be charged via their assessments. Bert stated the property does not have water rights, so they cannot be charged through the assessments. Bert stated he can hold any building permits and we can send a bill.

Financial Report

Bert stated the bills and descriptions have been provided by month. Marianne questioned if the project money had been received for the private owners' projects; Bert stated the private turnouts have been paid for by the owners. The BOR pipeline project is still in construction, so there has been no reimbursement received. The second project, in which the gate will be reimbursed back to the District, is the Christof/Carrasco gate. It has failed completely, and Steven is allowing them to get water through Wedertz #5. Ray and Brian are aware they will be paying for the gate, report, and installation. Steven questioned the charge for the report as he understood the grant covered the report on all the take outs. Bert stated the Christof/Carrasco was not part of the large scale report that the BOR grant is covering. The grant is covering in stream devices and the report at Wedertz #5, Main, Cardoni, and the end of the canal. There was talk about putting an instream device at Albright, but with the long crested weir there is no need for one. Steven requested a breakdown on what is and is not covered by the grant. Bert stated the main part of the canal is covered by the grant and the individual turnouts are the owner's responsibility. Steven stated he approved that the installation would be paid by the individual user and the design would be covered by the grant. Steven requested Marianne's recollection. Marianne stated she understood everything would be covered up to the installation. Bert stated two years ago, it was approved that the individual user would pay for the costs associated with their turnoutincluding the design report, installation, and materials. Copies of the grant were given, and it clearly states the key locations that would be covered. The grant will not cover anything that is not listed in the application. Steven requested Richard Nuti's recollection. Richard stated his recollection was that the grant was to pay for the work in the main canal and the individuals would be responsible for their own turnouts. Bert stated the budget can include an Engineering line item if that is what

is approved. There will be newer versions of the report available if the individual is obtaining NRCS or other grant funds. Marianne requested clarification; Bert stated NRCS required an up to date report when Richard was seeking NRCS money and Richard stated they had to personally pay for the report. Steven requested to know the cost of the Christof/Carrasco gate; Bert stated it was approximately \$2000. Steven clarified that the gate was \$2,000, design was \$2,588 and the installation would be approximately \$2,000; Bert confirmed. Steven expressed that is too expensive for 10 water righted acres. Bert stated he has spoken to Ray Carrasco and they discussed ways to save money. Steven reiterated his recollection was that the CalPoly reports were being covered by the grant. Steven questioned how the Christof/Carrasco project would be billed; Bert stated an invoice would be sent to them.

David Giorgi questioned when Lyon County pays assessments to the District; Bert stated they send us a monthly check and a report on who has paid. David asked if the individual ditch money goes straight to the ditch; Bert confirmed the assessments collected for a specific ditch or local improvement district goes straight to that fund.

Discussion and consideration of proposed budget and assessments for FY2019-2020

Bert stated the year-to-date budget figures and the current fund balance is provided in the packet. Reimbursement from BOR cannot be submitted until the project is completed. Marianne stated the spraying cost was more than projected; Bert stated it was higher due to Conservation District staff turnover and, because it was not sprayed for a year or two, there was a lot to spray. Future spraying should be significantly less. Richard confirmed that most of the spraying is done by hand; Bert stated a lot was done by hand and the boom was used where it could be. Richard requested to know if the Conservation District could go back right now and spray the tulles and willows; Bert stated they are always looking for work. Steven stated they should be given a budget. Rob requested to know if the Board has a problem with sterilization on his property from 338 to the barn; Steven stated there may be a concern of erosion. Rob stated he keeps the spray away from the water so there is no contamination, but he would like to eliminate the fire hazard around the barn. Steven stated it would be nice if the bottom of the ditch could be sprayed when the water goes off. Peter Fenili stated if the Conservation District does a good job, the

Canal should stay with them. Marianne asked if more personnel and another spray rig would be needed if the District takes on additional ditches; Bert stated it was nice to have the Conservation District spraying while the shop crew is working on other projects. Marianne questioned the liability with the Conservation District; Bert stated they carry their own liability insurance.

Rob questioned if there is any issue with salaries/wages. Marianne stated users have assisted with maintenance on their own properties. Bert stated the ditch rider has received a raise for the past two years.

Peter made a motion to keep the budget the same as prior years; Lu Weaver offered a second. The vote was called for and passed.

Discussion and consideration of planned upcoming scheduled maintenance and projects

Kris Leinassar requested to know when the future spraying will be done so he can move sheep.

- 1. Projects completed/started in the 2018/19 off season:
- Desert Creek Maintenance
- Saroni Drain Maintenance
- Saroni Conveyance Loss Study with ITRC- the report can be given if requested. The Canal owns three sensors right now, but the grant allows for more. The loss report is useful for the District as well as the individual user for grant opportunities.
- De-mossed three times
- Sprayed Canal from top to bottom & laterals
- Burned Canal- the guy on Kari Lane did not allow the District to burn through his property so that area is not maintained and there was water running in his front yard almost every day.
- Lateral A Pipeline Project
- New Weaver head gate
- Graded roads from top to bottom
- 2. Winter projects:

- Pipeline project behind Burns house (grant funds)- should be approximately 5 weeks after the water is turned off. Kris requested to know if the pipe was still good; Bert stated he looked at it last week and it looked good. There is approximately 2,335 acre feet of water left to be served this season.
- New turnout and measuring device at Christof/Carrasco
- Instream device with new turnout and measuring device at Main (grant funds)
- Instream device with new turnout and measuring device at Cardone (grant funds)
- Instream device with new turnout and measuring device at Wedertz #5 (grant funds)
- New turnouts and measuring devices at Lateral B gates (Heller, Berrington-Blackford, Sovereign)
- Repairs and permanent solution for end of Lateral B
- New turnouts and measuring devices at Nuti-Fenili
- New turnouts and measuring devices at Albright
- New turnouts and measuring devices at Straub
- New turnouts and measuring devices at Dryer #3
- New instream at the terminus of the Canal
- Repairs to old river headworks- Bert stated it is in the to-do list, but it is not a high priority as the Canal must be completely shut off. The concrete at the cave must be removed and replaced. There are large holes in the concrete, but since the controls are at the automation site, there is not a loss of water.
- Repairs to leaking concrete sections in Hoye Canyon & above Ithurburu's
- Flood wash bridge replacement- at Tran's property
- Saroni Conveyance Loss Study with ITRC- Peter requested to know if temperature affects the loss; Bert stated in some cases the temperature does affect the loss factor. General discussion on piping problematic areas of the Canal in the canyon and throughout the entirety.
- De-moss canal
- Spray road & Canal
- Grade Roads
- Clean Desert Creek & Saroni Drain

Rob asked if the District purchases bulk de-mossing material for purchase; Bert stated that, due to audit recommendations, the District does not purchase bulk material. It became a logistical nightmare to manage who wanted it, who came to pick it up, how much someone was supposed to have and who pays for it.

Discussion and consideration of ditch tender update on Water Season 2019

Jason Milligan stated the season went well. There was lots of flood water which alleviated the need for a lot of storage use. As a reminder, if users do use wells, be mindful of the 4.0 duty; Jason has no way to keep track of that data. Jason stated that if water needs to be shut off, call him 24 hours before as he does not schedule future shut off dates in his book. If he does not receive a phone call, the water will continue being delivered. Jason will attempt to return phone calls and text messages when he is able. The de-mossing went well, but it was tough with the flood water availability. Mossing needs to be done before the moss gets bad- not once it is too bad.

Peter requested that the retaining blocks need to be removed and retaining wall needs to be poured. The water from the bucket and the trash is displacing the rocks and the trash should be dumped further from the edge so it does not run back into the canal. Jason stated he would have liked to do that, but it was Bert's call. Bert stated the gate is cheap and does not work well. It will be corrected when the project is done at the Main.

Steven requested that the ditch rider notify users when they are getting close to running out of water. Jason stated he has the current balances on his tablet, and he can let people know. Marianne requested to know if there was a way to see their storage balance; Steven stated users can log in on the website, but it is very intermittent. Bert stated the site is up now, but the system will be changed from a pin to an email login.

Election of new Advisory Board members

Marianne asked what needs to be done if a Board Member does not show up for meetings; Steven stated the old bylaws stated that if a member does not show for three meetings they could be voted off- but he is unaware if the bylaws are in effect. David Giorgi asked if the District's Bylaws would be used in that case; Bert stated he does not think so; there was discussion in the 80's but nothing was approved for the Local Improvement District.

Marianne nominated Kristopher in her place; Steven nominated Richard Nuti and Rob Lewis; Peter offered a second. The vote was called for and passed.

Public Comment

David Giorgi asked that a member of the Saroni Canal come to the annual private ditch companies to discuss how the Saroni is run under the District. Steven asked how many ditches were interested; Bert stated he has interest from approximately six ditches. David stated there are a lot of unanswered questions that could possibly be answered by a Saroni member. Marianne asked what the cost impact of taking over ditches would be on the District; Bert stated each ditch will set their own assessments. Marianne stated there will be some charges on the District level for maintaining the ditches; Bert stated the private ditch projects will be put on the back burner so the District can focus on the ditches it manages. There will be funds available for the Ditch Rider to stay on the payroll during the off season to perform repairs and maintenance on the ditches they ride. Also, the individual companies will need to purchase their own materials, as the auditors have requested the District not purchase materials for ditches they do not own.

Meeting Called to Order

Bert called the meeting to order at 10:07 am.

Discussion and possible decision to moss the ditch

Bert stated he spoke to Ralph and gave him the indication we will need eight barrels. Ralph stated he is compiling a list because he gets a price break on an order of 40 barrels. There is not a lot of water, so only two de-mossings may be needed. Steven recommended purchasing six or eight barrels and de-mossing at least once. Discussion on the Ditch Rider working with all users to coordinate when the best time to shut off would be so that crops are not compromised. Discussion on possibly mossing May 23rd and again at the end of June or early August. Richard stated there is already moss at Lateral A.

Discussion and possible decision to spray for weeds on portions of the banks and/or roadways

Bert reported that the Conservation District is currently spraying Topaz, but the plan is to spray the Saroni. Jason and Ed have kept in contact regarding the spots that have gotten bad. Kris requested an advance notice so he can plan accordingly with livestock. Consensus was to proceed with the spraying.

Other topics

Bert advised the new pipeline has water running through. Some slight grooming still needs to be done in the area and a pad is being poured next week, but other than that, it seems to be working well.

Board Comments

Kris requested better control of the backhoe when cleaning out the inlet of the pipe and the grate at Lateral A. Richard suggested keeping the backhoe away from the gates. Bert stated trash forks can be made and supplied to users as the ditch rider is cleaning the grates a few times per week and any user is welcome to clean when they notice things getting backed up.

Adjournment

Meeting was adjourned at 10:20am.

Review the newly updated turnout and stop at all future turnout upgrade locations.

All attendees met at the Christof/Carrasco Turnout to view the setup. Discussion was held on the costs, installation measures, and efficiency. Jason stated the setup works well in that the water can be set in the main canal and the measurement can be seen in the stilling well as well as at the gate.

All attendees continued to next sites. General discussion was held on types of gates, measuring devices, and the construction setup. Bert stated he will work on getting a price sheet for metered gates and gates that can be purchased as manual right now but can be converted to automated in the future. At Wedertz #5, discussion was held regarding moving the takeout to the East per ITRC recommendation. At the Main Turnout, discussion was held on realigning the ditch as it is currently has an awkward setup. At the Cardone, discussion was held on the current condition of the turnout. The final meeting stop was the Nuti-Fenili turnout where the updates were shown and discussed.

Discussion and Possible Decision on 2020-2021 winter work.

Bert reported that normal repairs and maintenance will be performed along with the instream device installations and turnout upgrades.

Review and discussion on draft agenda for the Saroni Annual meeting.

Bert provided a draft meeting agenda for review. The meeting is tentatively set for Wednesday September 2nd, but it can be changed. Also, the location is variable as the Open Meeting Directive is still in effect. The meeting can be held at the District, but there are capacity limitations. An outdoor meeting may be the best option at this point, unless the Governor changes his Directive.

Steven requested an update on the data from the data loggers; Bert stated the numbers can be presented during the water season update. Steven reported that Mr. Burns had questioned him on whether the District completed all of the items promised with the pipeline; Bert stated a culvert had been completed across the front of his driveway and the wash from the flood bridge had been redirected and riprapped to direct the water away from his home. An agenda item will be added to inform the Board of what was requested and what was completed; an agreement can be drafted as well. Steven questioned what was happening with the Deforest/Tran problem; Bert reported that the Deforest's signed for their certified letter, but Mr. Tran did not claim his. The Tran property has been sold, but no improvements have been made on the property. Steven requested an item be added to the agenda to discuss what the next step is, as the crossing is unsafe and poses a liability problem.

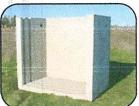
